The Department of Health provides assistance to local government units, people's organizations and other members of civil society in effectively implementing programs, projects and services that promote the health and well-being of every Filipino; prevent and control diseases among populations at risks; protect individuals, families and communities exposed to hazards and risks; and treat, manage, rehabilitate individuals affected by disease and disability.</p> | <p>Land Acquisition and Distribution (LAD)</p> | <p>PHP 143.34</p> | <p>The 139,755 hectares is composed of 118,265 hectares with Emancipation Patents (EPs)/ Certificates of Land Ownership Award (CLOAs) which are already distributed to 51,698 agrarian reform beneficiaries (ARBs) and 21,533 hectares (1,896 LHS) which are already processed by DAR and are for EP/CLOA registration by the Land Registration Authority (LRA). Technically, the DAR's tasks are already completed once the the EPs/CLOAs reached the last stage of land acquisition process, that is, once the EPs/CLOAs are due for registration by LRA.
