The Office of the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process (OPAPP) shall be charged with the management of the comprehensive peace process and has the authority to coordinate and integrate, in behalf of the President, all existing peace efforts. Further, the Office of the Presidential Adviser on Peace Process shall provide technical and administrative support to the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process in the discharge of functions for the political reforms; consensus-building and empowerment for peace; peaceful, negotiated political settlement with different armed groups; programs for reconciliation, reintegration into mainstream society and rehabilitation; addresing concerns arising from continuing armed hostilities, and building and nurturing a climate conducive to peace.
